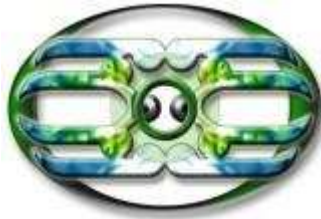


Te Ngutu Kura for Macintosh - Installation Instructions

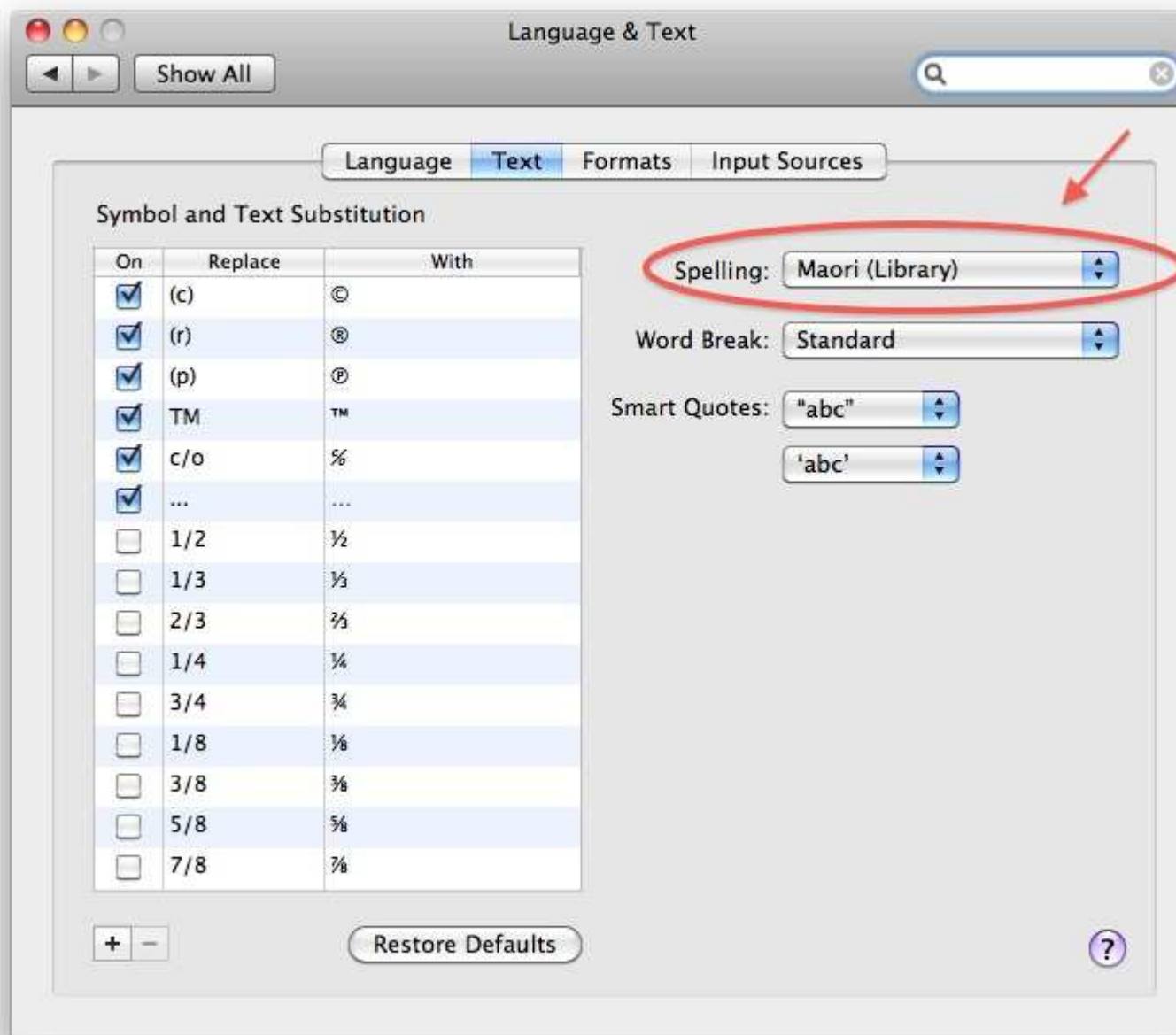

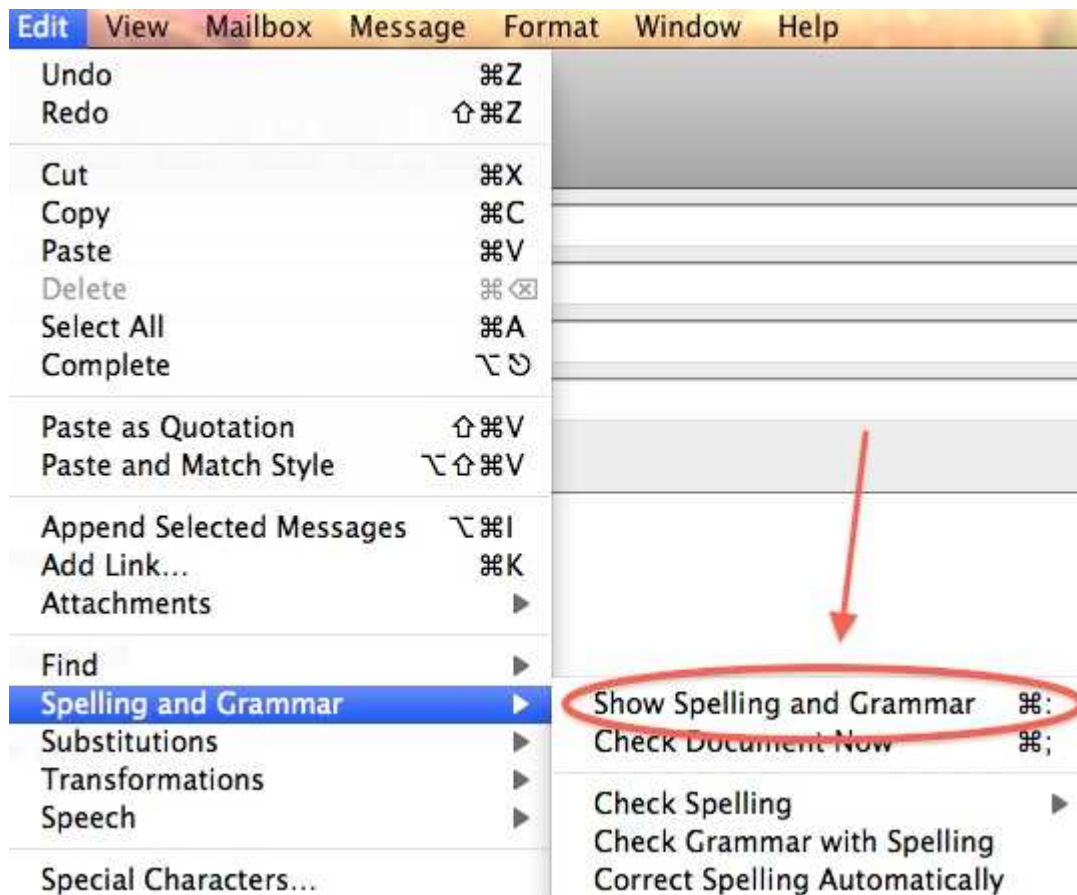
1. Download the .dic and .aff files for Te Ngutu Kura Macintosh from <http://www.maorispellchecker.net.nz>
2. Put the two files in the directory 'Home/Users/'UserName'/Library/Spelling'
3. Select 'System Preferences' - 'Language and Text'



On the 'Text' page change the spelling to Maori (Library)



Open an application such as Mail, to turn Te Ngutu Kura on.
In Mail, type your message and then to start the spell check 'Edit' - 'Spelling and Grammar' - 'Show Spelling and Grammar'

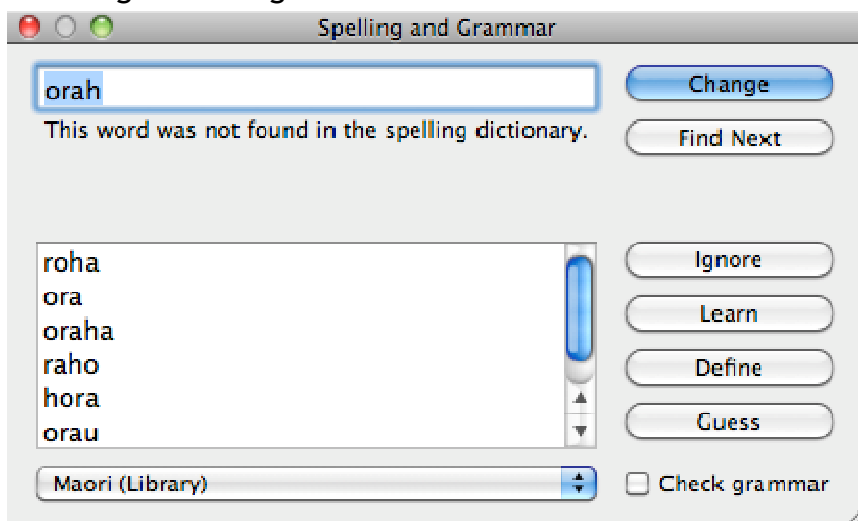


If you have typed this:

Kia orah mai koutou e hoa mā

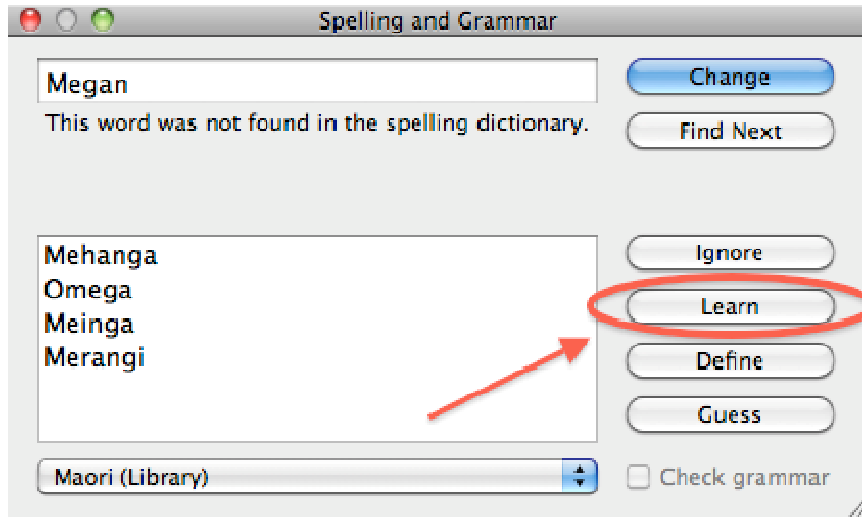
Megan Edwards Architects Ltd

You will get a dialog box that looks like this



This operates like a 'normal' spell checker.

Note that if you want to 'Learn' a word (For example, you want to ensure that the 4 words 'Megan', 'Edwards', 'Architects', 'Ltd' are always regarded as 'correct' then when they are marked as a spelling mistake, click on 'Learn')



This will have the effect of adding the words to a file called 'mi_NZ' (no extension) in the directory where you put the .dic and .aff files, namely 'Home/Users/'UserName'/Library/Spelling'

If you want to 'unlearn' these words then you will have to delete them from this file directly.
